At our Feb. meeting Joe Montoya was officially appointed our new Color Corps Commander replacing Michael Chevarria who served admirably as the lead CCC for the past several years. Thank you Michael for all your efforts and making our assembly color corps one of the best in the state. Leo Armenta will continue to be the ACCC and will work with Joe to coordinate and Leo will continue to serve as the Nativity point person for the color corps.

As previously mentioned, Bethlehem Assembly members from Nativity of Our Lord have been encouraged by District Master Muller to begin the process of chartering a parish assembly at Nativity following Supreme's ideal of One Parish, One Council, One Assembly. A committee of Nativity SK's has been formed and paper work has been received to begin the process of formulating an assembly. How long this process will take and when an assembly at Nativity will be chartered is uncertain but should happen within the year. When the assembly at Nativity is formed it will be up to individual Nativity SK's to decide if they would prefer to remain a member of the Bethlehem Assembly or to transfer to the Nativity assembly.

Election of officers for the Bethlehem Assembly are just around the corner and we currently have four officer positions occupied by Nativity SK's the FN, Pilot, Scribe and Inner Sentinel. The Nativity SK's currently in these positions will fulfill their terms this fraternal year and will likely transfer to the new assembly when chartered and not expected to seek election in the Bethlehem Assembly for the next fraternal year thus opening up several vacancies. It is also my understanding our current Purser is interested in moving up the chairs and desiring to run for another office and a Trustee position will be expired thus creating 5-6 positions that will be vacated assuming the remaining officers elect to continue. With so many positions being vacated it would be prudent for us to start forthwith in recruiting and encouraging members to consider serving the assembly as an officer for the 2017-18 Fraternal Year.

The nominations for officers will be opened at the April 25th meeting, published immediately to the assembly at large, nominations will than be re-opened at the May 23rd meeting than closed and the election will be promptly held at the May meeting.

How About College Funding? Most experts agree that a college education will be a prerequisite to better jobs in the future and college graduates will earn significantly more over their working years than nongraduates.

In helping you estimate the future costs of educating your children, the following assumptions were used:

Tuition asset tax bracket: 35.0%

Tuition asset ROR: 5.0%

Tuition inflation rate: 5.0%

Present college assets: \$0

Annual tuition 2017: \$20,000

With these figures in mind, let's look at the actual projections. Imagine that you are preparing for two children.

Name Present Age Year Tuition

Daughter 6 years old: in 2029 tuition will be \$35,917 and in 2030 \$37,713


Son, 4 years old, in 2031 \$39,198 and in 2032 tuition will cost \$43,158. By 2033 it will rise to \$43,657 and in 2034 it will sky rocket to \$45,840. This will be a Total Outlay of \$325,483.

There are several solutions. Using the assumptions above, an additional lump sum of \$204,219 would need to be saved today in order to fund the future education costs of your children. On a monthly basis, you will have to save \$1,296 every month for the next 17 years just to cover the projected education costs by your son's graduation. A permanent life insurance that accumulates funds to help pay future education costs while also guaranteeing a lump sum payment in the unlikely event of the your death, can accomplish this. While these plans are not realistic for every family, there are several COMBINED methods that can be used to fund your children's tuition. .*To be eligible for both the Family Fraternal Benefit Program, and the Orphan Fraternal Benefit Program, the member must be in good standing, and either he or his wife must be insured under a Knights of Columbus certificate requiring an annual premium of at least \$150, or providing at least \$5,000 in permanent life insurance coverage. Eligibility for the Orphan Fraternal Benefit Program is also contingent on the child being covered by an individual Knights of Columbus certificate.
